



Is it an Emergency?



to an Emergency Room (ER) or call 911

if you have any of these sudden, life-threatening symptoms:

- Bleeding that won't stop
- Broken bones
- Chest or other severe pain
- Poisoning
- Seizure
- Pregnancy labor

- · Difficulty seeing, speaking, moving or breathing
- High fever
- Severe abdominal pain
- Animal bite
- Drug overdose

CALL your doctor or urgent care facility

(avoid the wait and cost of an ER) if you have these non-life-threatening symptoms:

- Sprains and strains
- Mild pain during your period
- Diarrhea
- Well baby checks
- Vomiting
- Immunizations
- Cuts and scrapes

- Coughs and colds
- Earache
- Diaper rash
- Sore throat.
- Medicine refills
- Tooth problems
- Lice, scabies or ringworm

Sometimes you may not be sure if you need to go to the emergency room.
